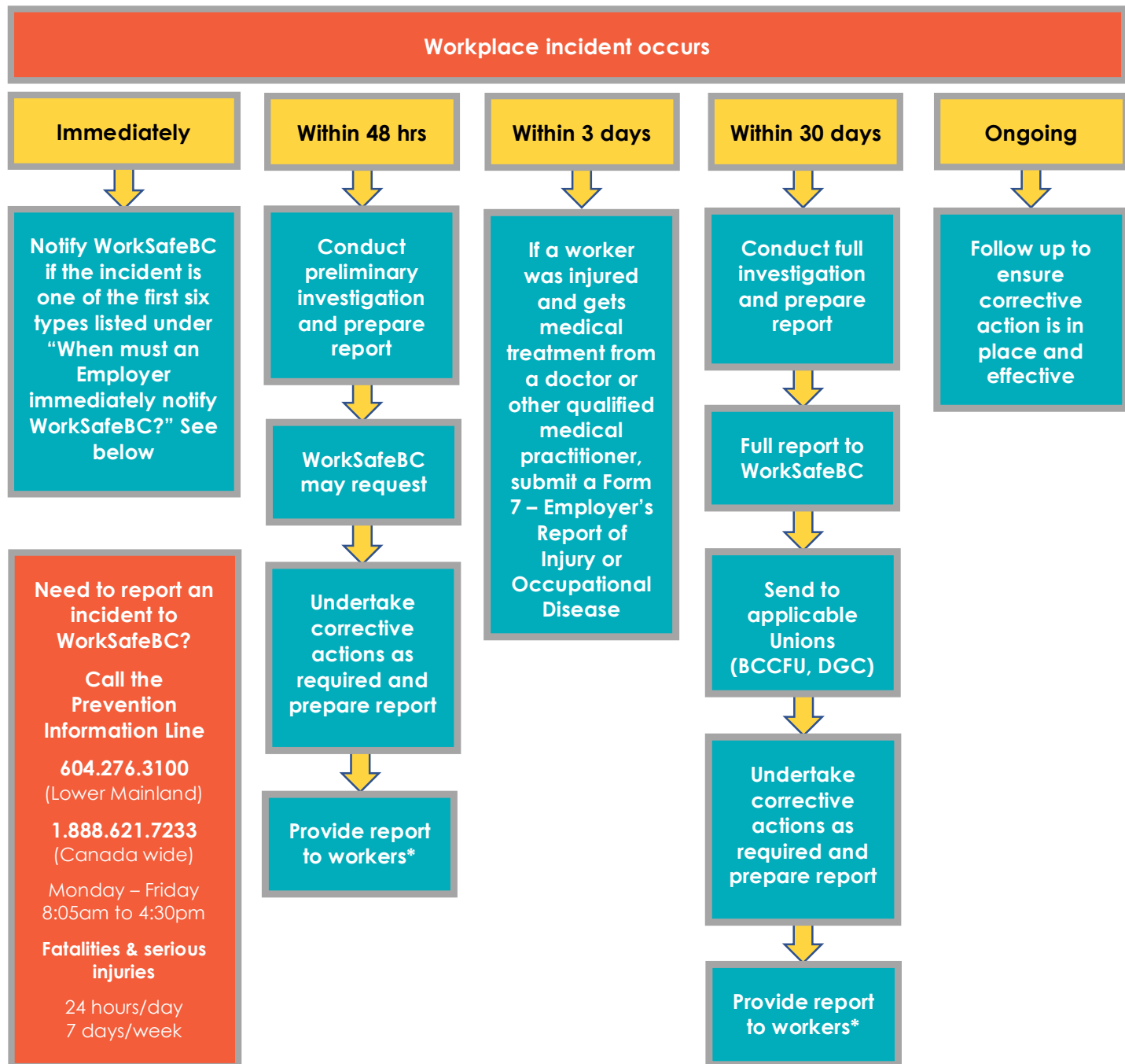


What To Do After A Workplace Incident



When must an Employer immediately notify WorkSafeBC?

- Serious injury to or death of a worker
- Major structural failure or collapse of a building, bridge, tower, crane, hoist, temporary construction support system, or excavation
- Major release of a hazardous substance
- Fire or explosion that had a potential for causing serious injury
- Blasting incident causing personal injury
- Dangerous incident involving explosives (even if no one was hurt)

*You must provide all four reports to the joint health and safety committee or worker health and safety representative, as applicable. If there is no joint committee or worker representative, you must post the reports in the workplace.
