Actsafe is a safety association that serves B.C.'s motion picture and perfroming arts industries sectors by providing safety training, educationa nd resources for employers and workers.

Our role is to provide arts workers with the necessary support to ensure that everyone goes home at the end of the day.

Actsafe is governed by the industries it represents. We operate through two standing committees that represent the motion picture and performing arts communities. Membership on these committees includes both employer and worker representatives.

HEALTH & SAFETY ADVICE

Free advice on health or safety related questions or concerns about issues in your motion picture orperforming arts work environment. Our advisors will

answer questions and respond to reports of health and safety concerns.

FREE HEARING TESTING

Actsafe provides free hearing testing of motion picture and performing arts workers in occupations deemed 'at risk' of a hearing injury.

FREE RESPIRATOR FIT TESTING

Actsafe provides free respirator fit testing of motion picture and performing arts workers in situations where air quality may be compromised.

Actsafe offers an industry leading AED rental and purchase program that allows your production the ability to have a potentially life saving device at a very affordable cost. Whether its a long-running television series or a short run theatre production, having

an AED on site will provide an added sense of safety should a worker fall victim to a sudden cardiac arrest.
